All activities will be charged in 8 instalments from October to May.

Enrolment will ONLY be available via the app from 14th August to 12th September 2025. After this period, you will need to contact the school to check availability and the possibility for enrolment.

If an activity does not reach the minimum number of participants required for its performance, The British School of Costa Daurada reserves the right to withdraw it from the programme.

Please note that all activities are planned according to the enrolled children, so the possibility to change from one extracurricular activity to another will be very limited.

Lego-Academy of Robotics and Coding

Lego - Academy of Robotics and Coding

Nursery to Year 1 - 50' sessions	48 €/month
Year 2 to Year 5 - 60' sessions	52 €/month

Everywhere you turn, teachers, parents and others are talking about coding and robotics for learners of all ages. Robotics and coding provide hands-on and creative opportunities for learners to invent, solve problems and create – perhaps the most appropriate implementation of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics). These experiences provide the opportunity to teach STEM in a multidisciplinary way, with a hands-on approach, which also happens to be engaging and fun.

We teach coding and robotics because, as educators, it is our job to recognize that our students are 21st century students; they are global innovators, thinkers and problem solvers.

The number of resources for teaching computer science in these various environments is also growing very fast.

Many organisations and schools are taking up the challenge and embedding coding and robotics into their programs to support the development of coding and robotics skills in all their students and engage their pedagogical approach towards digital age skills in technology, teamwork and creativity.

Students start by using Bee-Bots and Blue-Bots and then jump into more complex proposals starting with Simple Machines and Lego WeDo and free-form robotics to learn and also to participate in national competitions (KS2 & KS3).

Robotics and coding within STEM and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) initiatives have become universal throughout educational entities around the globe.

So... Let's get started with Robotics and Coding!

There will be different groups according to age. From Year 2 all children will participate in the Lego League.

In order to prepare for the official LEGO® League competition, each group will be limited to 12 students, following the order of registration, as required by the tournament rules.



If there are enough registrations, the possibility of opening an additional group at school will be considered. In that case, we will organize an internal competition two Fridays before the official tournament, where the winners will be selected to attend the official event. Additionally, a second internal competition will take place during Science Week.

Lastly, the LEGO® extracurricular activity for students from Year 6 to Year 11 will take place on the same weekday as before, but this year it will be divided into two different groups based on level: Advanced and Standard.

The BSCD Music Academy in association with the ABRSM

After launching our very own Music Academy, The BSCD Music Academy in association with the ABRSM, during the 2024/2025 academic year, we are excited to continue this initiative into 2025/2026.

This school is established with the support of the ABRSM (Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music). The ABRSM is a world leader in music exams and assessments, with over 630,000 candidates taking exams each year in more than 90 countries.

The ABRSM is connected with four of the leading conservatories in the UK:

- Royal Academy of Music (London)
- Royal College of Music (London)
- Royal Northern College of Music (Manchester)
- Royal Scottish Academy of Music and Drama (Glasgow)

ABRSM exams are designed to motivate and inspire pupils at any level, providing them with clear goals and realistic targets to aim for. They are a valuable tool in a comprehensive music education, offering a reliable means of assessing a pupil's performance and tracking their individual progress. Grade exams are available for over 35 instruments, including percussion, piano, horn, choral conducting and singing.

Activities Offered for the Next Academic Year:

- Music: Play, Sing, Move! The ideal activity for the youngest pupils to spark their artistic interest and introduce them to the exciting world of music.
- **The ABRSM Music Theory:** This course covers music theory according to grades that start at Grade 1 and progress to Grade 8.
- Individual Instrument Lessons: Available for the following instruments:
 - Piano
 - Drums

In the Piano and Drum activities, priority will be given to students who participated last year.

- **Theatre:** A group for pupils from Year Reception to Year 2 and another group for older pupils from Year 3 to Year 6.
- **Junior Band:** A space to share music and perform both classical and modern pieces with peers.

All individual sessions will last 30 minutes, while sessions for Music Theory, Theatre and Junior Band will last 60 minutes.

The BSCD Music Academy in association with the ABRSM

Exams and Assessments:

- Grades 1 to 8 Music Theory: These eight levels are part of the learning programme designed by the Royal School of Music and are open to all pupils of any age and any instrument. Pupils can directly enter the level deemed appropriate by their teacher, based on their skills and work capacity, without needing to progress through each level sequentially. This allows for a potentially shorter completion time than the standard eight-year course. After each level assessment, pupils receive a detailed report and, if successful, a certificate. From Grade 6 onwards, pupils must also pass a written theory exam in addition to the practical exam.
- **Instrument Exams:** Practical Instrumental Exams focus on all-round musical knowledge and skills, including performance. They are face-to-face exams and available for Initial Grade: Piano and Bowed Strings only and Grades 1 to 8: a wide range of instruments, singing and Singing for Musical Theatre.
- Diploma (DipABRSM), Licentiate (LRSM), and Fellowship (FRSM): After completing Grade 8, pupils can pursue higher levels equivalent to Diploma, Licentiate and Master's degrees.

Obtaining these qualifications through the ABRSM is highly prestigious internationally and complements other systems, such as conservatories.

All exams will be held at The British School of Costa Daurada.

The prices of ABRSM official exams and the books for preparation and monitoring of activities are not included in the activity fee and will be billed separately if necessary

Music: Play, Sing, Move!

Nursery & Reception + Year 1 - Group Sessions 50′ 48 €/month

In this fun and engaging class, our youngest pupils will develop their love for singing, music and play! Pupils will explore a variety of genres of music, types of instruments and styles of dance.

But why is singing, music and movement so important for young children?

Singing – Research shows that learning a song is much more effective for memorising and recalling information than the spoken word. The British Council promotes singing as a tool for language success, noting its benefits on pronunciation by encouraging proper mouth movements. Singing also enhances reading skills by improving phonological awareness. Additionally, songs are an effective way to learn grammatical functions, collocations, phrasal verbs, idiomatic expressions and colloquialisms. Music and language share features such as pitch, stress, tone, rhythm, and pauses, which children can imitate before they learn to speak. Essentially, we learn to sing before we learn to speak. Also, singing is fun and a fantastic means for self-expression!

Music – Allowing little ones to play percussion instruments like drums, maracas, or a piano can significantly benefit their development. Research highlights the value of these activities in building fine and gross motor skills, supporting sensory development, enhancing hand-eye coordination, teaching patience and perseverance and enhancing emotional skills. Research has also found that young children who play instruments show increased brain development, particularly in areas related to language, speech perception, sound processing, and reading skills. But most importantly, music is fun and when children have fun, they are more open to learning.

Movement - Movement strengthens muscles and bones, improves flexibility and coordination, builds endurance, develops kinaesthetic memory and supports cardiovascular health. Mentally and emotionally, movement acts as a mood booster, helping children to express their emotions and shake off bad moods through the release of endorphins. It enhances confidence and self-esteem, builds resilience through practice and creates a sense of accomplishment when new moves or actions are mastered. Children learn spatial awareness and how to share the dance floor with others and finally, through movement children cultivate a greater appreciation for music!

Year 5 to Year 11 - 60' sessions/week



*Children participating in Swimming at the Royal Tarraco will be taken there by school bus and welcomed by the monitors of the activity. Everyone will need to be picked up from there by an adult.

This guided activity will take place in the pool of the Royal Tarraco. Children can take the school bus and must be picked up at 17:15 pm at the Royal Tarraco.

The main goal of this activity is to improve the physical condition of children and their confidence in the aquatic environment. The monitors will do a small test at the beginning od the course to find out at what level they should work with the children.

Children under the age of 3 must be transported to Royal Tarraco by their parent or guardian.



Additionally, for hygiene and safety reasons, the use of swim diapers will be mandatory during all sessions.

Let's Dance

Pre-Nursery - 60' sessions (1 day)	48€/month
Nursery + Reception - 60' sessions (1 day)	48€/month
Year 1 + Year 2 + Year 3 - 60' sessions (1 day)	48€/month

This extracurricular activity aims to present a very rich variety of motor experiences, where you learn technical aspects of different modern dance, such as hip hop, jazz, salsa and some more of the classic style like ballet.

Dance and play are the main focus of each session, as the students learn to express themselves through movement and rhythm. Additional benefits include, overcoming emotional barriers, growingin self-confidence and the higher self-esteemed involved in learning a new skill.

Places for the Dance activity are limited and will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis:

- 8 spots for the Pre-Nursery group
- 10 spots for the Nursery and Reception group
- 10 spots for the Year 1 to Year 3 group

If we receive a high number of registrations, we will consider opening an additional group at school.



Multisport

Nursery + Reception + Year 1 - 50' sessions

48 €/month

During this activity, children will enjoy a taste of many different sports. This activity is aimed to enhance the development of their motor skills.

This activity will be carried out in English by Miss Fernández, although grouping may be subject to change according to the abilities of the enrolled children.

Judo

Reception to Year 3 - 60' sessions (1 day)

45€/month

Children participating in Judo at the Royal Tarraco will be taken there by school bus and welcomed by the monitors of the activity. Everyone will need to be picked up at 17:15 pm at the Royal Tarraco.

We separate the judo activity into two main groups: PSICO-JUDO and JUDO.

- In the psicho-judo activity we will learn the basis and the values of the judo discipline, but in additional will be helping the children with their flexibility and physical strength. This is of great use and importance for physical activity in general, but also as a foundation for those wishing to participate in judo at primary level in the future.
- In the case of judo in Primary, we seek that little by little the students learn the physical and technical aspects of the sport, whilst also learning the value system that is promoted within judo community.

Volleyball

Year 2 to Year 6 - 60' sessions



This project seeks to introduce the practice of volleyball among children and young people to, gradually discover and perfect the technique by encouraging basic motor skills (movements, turns, jumps, throws, shots) and more complex ones.

One of the main focus of the activity is the improvement of physical condition, especially the endurance, speed, flexibility and strength. All through a methodology that allows sport to be used as an element for group cohesion, the promotion of social skills and the acquisition of central values for integral development of the participants.

The Sant Pere i Sant Pau Volleyball Club of Tarragona assumes the technical direction of the activity. With more than 40 years in the elite of national volleyball, the club makes available to The British School of Costa Daurada the best trainers, all of them active and taking part on top level sporting challenges.

Tennis & Padel

Nursery + Reception + Primary 60' sessions 54 euros/month (includes bus)

This is a mixed proposal, alternating one discipline per week, that will allow the children to choose and swap from one sport to the other in the future. Tennis is one of the most followed and practiced sports throughout the world, due to the myriad of physicaland psychological benefits that its practice brings. These sports improve physical condition, develop musculature, the capacity for attention, motor coordination and encourage social development.

Many children at the age of 4 already show quite an advanced motor coordination capacity that enables them to begin to play racket sports, but it is necessary to take into account that their capacity for attention is not yet very developed. In addition, thanks to this sport the little ones will begin to strengthen their speed, agility and reflexes, toning at the same time all the muscles in their body.

Although these classes do not serve to improve their technique, they will make the child become familiar with the equipment and with the basic ideas of the game.

Most experts say that the best age to begin playing tennis in a more formal manner is at 5 or 6 years of age. When the children reach this age, they have already quite developed their psychomotor skills, their coordination and attention, adapting themselves much better to the demands of the game.

This is the perfect age to let children experiment with racket shots, balancing the ball and coming into contact with the basic technique of this sport.

Golf

Year 1 to Year 6 - 60' sessions

54 €/month (includes bus)

Golf is a very complete sport in which many muscles of the body are worked.

It is also a sport that favors the dynamism of the body and the management of breathing during the swing, and is perfect for developing coordination, position in space and balance.

Golf is an activity that can be done at any age, which is ideal for family practice.

Playing golf, in addition to the physical aspect, helps young people to develop strategies for relating and facilitates making friends with other players in a healthy and positive environment.

At these early ages, children learn important ethical values through the rules of the game, such as Respect and Honesty.

Magic

Year 4 to Year 7 - 60' sessions

48 €/month

Studying magic increases self-esteem, improves human relationships, helps develop communication skills and much more.

They will learn the basics of the art of magic.

Children will learn magic using everyday objects such as letters, coins, paper, pencils, elastics, etc. These will help them surprise their audience wherever they are. In addition, they will make some of the magic sets themselves.

They will learn scientific magic, magic with the body, math magic (the magic of numbers), magic with objects, card magic (magic with cards), magic stories, challenges, challenges, optical illusions, jokes, etc.

To learn any art you have to know its origins. They will see the exciting history of the art of magic: the first magicians, great personalities of magic, anecdotes of great magicians, etc.

At the end of the course the students will make a performance showing everything they have learned.

This activity will be in charge of Óscar Vallhonrat (in English), a magician who is passionate about classical magic.

He will propose different workshops where students start in the art of magic.

They will learn two or three magic tricks that with a little practice they will be able to present to their audience. In addition, these workshops can be adapted to improve certain areas such as Mathematics, psychomotor skills, spatial orientation, etc.

Chess

Year 4 to Year 7 - 60' sessions

48€/month

We teach the fundamental techniques of this sport and we offer them the opportunity to put them into practice in very participatory classes, through games and challenges.

Benefits:

- Develop and perfect logical-mathematical thinking. It has special benefits in improving the ability to solve problems and make decisions, situations that must always be faced in a game of chess
- Exercises concentration and patience, contributing to the improvement of attention and memory. In addition, it exercises the imagination, since it implies anticipating possible game situations and modifying the strategy accordingly
- It promotes healthy competitiveness, as well as respect for the rules of the game and a healthy competitiveness.
- It fosters the capacity for self-analysis and the spirit of improvement. Being a strategy game, being a better player involves self-criticism to detect strengths and improvement for future games.

Art and design

Year 1 to Year 3 - 50' sessions

48€/month

Allow your child the time to be creative and learn a variety of new artistic skills. We will be exploring colour, texture, different medias and studying different artists and their ways of developing art and design. We will aim to use some of these artists work as a base to then develop our own creativity.

We are delighted to introduce The BSCD Language Academy & Learning Clubs, a programme that builds on the curricular and social languages of our school: Catalan, Spanish, English and German.

For our youngest learners, we offer innovative activities that combine creativity with language learning. As pupils progress, we provide targeted support and enrichment opportunities in each of our core languages. This includes extra help for those needing additional assistance, as well as preparation for official language examinations. In recent years, many of our pupils have successfully achieved A2 and B1 German qualifications through these programmes.

We also offer tailored preparation for foreign students to obtain official A2 or B1 certification in Catalan and Spanish, helping them achieve recognized language qualifications that support both their academic progress and integration into the local context.

Our commitment to language excellence extends beyond the classroom. For example, secondary pupils enjoy after-hours daily access to the library from Monday to Thursday, 4–5 pm, a highly successful initiative introduced last academic year. This space offers a conducive environment for self-study and language practice, further supporting our pupils' linguistic development.

In addition, we are excited to launch Learning Clubs for secondary students—dedicated, subject-focused sessions designed to reinforce learning in key areas such as Mathematics, English, Science, Drama and Art. These clubs offer a supportive and stimulating environment where students can deepen their understanding, collaborate with peers, and engage with content in creative and meaningful ways.

We are also proud to offer a unique opportunity for pupils to join the team that writes and produces our school's quarterly newspaper. Budding researchers and writers are awarded a scholarship that allows them to work alongside accomplished journalists who lead this project, gaining invaluable experience in journalism and contributing to an outstanding publication that makes our entire community proud.

Language Academies

Language support for Primary and Secondary students

Our Language Academies are designed to provide targeted support in **Catalan and Spanish** for Primary students who are new to these languages. The goal is to help them integrate smoothly, build comprehension, and gain confidence in both spoken and written communication through fun, practical, and level-appropriate activities.

FOR PRIMARY STUDENTS (YEAR 2 TO YEAR 6):

Catalan for New Arrivals

Aimed at students who are beginning to learn Catalan. Sessions focus on basic vocabulary, simple structures, and everyday communication situations in a playful and engaging way.

• Spanish for Foreign Students

Designed for students whose first language is not Spanish. Activities emphasise listening and speaking skills to support confident communication in daily school life.

Language Academies

FOR YEAR 6 & SECONDARY STUDENTS

We offer specialised language clubs that provide in-depth learning and preparation for internationally recognised official exams. Each club runs **two** hours per week, spread over two afternoons.

German (A2 and B1 levels) - From Year 7 to Year 11

These sessions focus on deepening students' German skills and preparing them for the official Goethe-Institut exams. Lessons include grammar, reading, listening, and speaking practice using official materials.

• Spanish as a Foreign Language (ELE) - From Year 6 to Year 11

This club supports students learning Spanish as a second language. It helps them integrate into regular Spanish (Castellano) classes while also preparing for the DELE Escolar exams (Diploma of Spanish as a Foreign Language), awarded by the Instituto Cervantes.

• Catalan as a Foreign Language- From Year 6 to Year 11

Aimed at students who are integrating into the Catalan-speaking school system. The club strengthens language skills and supports preparation for future Catalan as a Foreign Language official exams.

PRIMARY LEARNING CLUBS

Academic support for Year 3 to Year 6 students

This club is designed to support Primary students with their studies and homework. With guidance from a teacher, pupils will be able to manage their study time more effectively, ask questions, and work in a calm, structured environment.


